PATHFINDER FUNDRAISING. It is eight months and counting until the 2024 International Pathfinder Camporee in Gillette, Wyoming, and our Howell Mountaineers are hard at work fundraising. The total amount needed for all expenses is \$36,000. Since May, they have raised \$4,367 at the Bikeathon, from waffle dog sales at the Fall Fest, and through your generous donations at Pathfinder car washes. This leaves \$31,633 still to raise. Watch for upcoming fundraising events such as a screening of the new Rich Aguilera movie on January 6, an Indian dinner later in January, and waffle dog sales. Pathfinders are also hosting a hybrid online/catalog sale through Gifts 'N' Things which sells Yankee candles, magazine subscriptions, sweets and snacks, kitchen and home items, gift wrap, and more (www.supportmyschool.org).
